# About University .....

The Nanaji Deshmukh Veterinary Science University, Jabalpur was established on 3<sup>rd</sup> November 2009, under the Act No. 16 of the Madhya Pradesh Pashu Chikitsa Vigyan Vishwavidyalaya Adhiniyam, 2009 with the objectives to impart education in different branches of Veterinary, Fisheries and allied sciences, for the advancement of learning and prosecution of research in Veterinary and Fisheries Sciences; and to undertake the extension of such sciences to the rural people in co-operation with the State Veterinary Department. NDVSU has been ranked 47<sup>th</sup> among Agricultural Universities during 2019 by ICAR, New Delhi. The ICAR has accredited post graduate programmes of College of Veterinary Science & A.H., Jabalpur & Mhow. The undergraduate programme of all the three campii has been accredited by the council. The well established University has Faculty of Veterinary Science and Animal Husbandry under which three Veterinary Colleges are located at Jabalpur, Mhow and Rewa and a College of Fisheries Science, located at Jabalpur. Along with this Animal Biotechnology Centre and School of Wildlife Forensic and Health, are also located at Jabalpur. The University offers a two years Diploma Course in Animal Husbandry in five Veterinary Polytechnics located at Jabalpur, Mhow, Rewa, Bhopal and Morena, with an aim to produce human resource for the Veterinary Field Assistant cadre of the State Government. The university has introduced a one year post graduate diploma course in wildlife health management.

College of Veterinary Science and Animal Husbandry, Jabalpur, established on July 8, 1948, has transformed over the years from the modest beginning in small hutments into full fledged Veterinary University. College of Veterinary Science and Animal Husbandry, Mhow was established on 12<sup>th</sup> July 1955. The alumni of colleges have created an impeccable impact not only in our country but in other countries also. Both the colleges became constituent of the Jawaharlal Nehru Krishi Vishwa Vidyalaya, Jabalpur, on 2<sup>nd</sup> October 1964. The College of Veterinary Science and Animal Husbandry, Rewa, came into existence in the year 2007, as a constituent unit of Jawaharlal Nehru Krishi Vishwa Vidyalaya, Jabalpur. The constituent colleges, today, have a full complement of the state-of-the-art laboratories in 17 departments, each under the guidance of highly qualified and experienced team of scientists. The College of Fishery Science, Jabalpur was established in the year 2012.

# 1. Admission for Master's Degree Programme

- i. Admission to Master's degree programme (M.V.Sc./ M.F.Sc./ M.Sc. Animal Biotechnology) shall be through entrance examination. Candidates shall be admitted in different subjects as per the merit list generated on the basis of above entrance examination. The cut-off marks of entrance examination for admission will be 45.0 for unreserved and OBC category candidates; and 40.0 for SC and ST category candidates. Further, the requirement of minimum- OGPA / percentage of marks for admission shall be 6.00/10 or equivalent OGPA/equivalent percentage of marks (60%) for unreserved and OBC categories and 5.50/10 or equivalent OGPA/equivalent percentage of marks (55%) for SC and ST category candidates in Bachelor's degree (B.V.Sc. & A.H. / B.F.Sc. / B.Sc.).
- ii. In cases where, two or more candidates have obtained equal marks in the entrance examination, the inter-se-merit of such students shall be determined in order of the following preference:
  - a. OGPA/percentage of marks in Bachelor's degree examination.
  - b. In cases where, the OGPA/percentage of marks in Bachelor's degree examination are same, then inter-se-merit of such candidates shall be prepared on the basis of percentage of marks in Higher Secondary School Certificate Examination (12<sup>th</sup> standard).
  - c. In cases where, the percentage of marks shall be same in Higher Secondary School Certificate Examination (12<sup>th</sup> standard), the inter-se-merit of such candidates shall be prepared on the basis of age of the candidates. The candidates having more age shall be higher in merit followed by students having lesser age.
- iii. The question paper for admission in **M.V.Sc.** degree programme shall consist of 100 questions of one mark each in the form of multiple choices. The question paper shall be from all the subjects of B.V.Sc. and A.H.
- iv. The question paper for admission in **M.F.Sc.** degree programme shall consist of 100 questions of one mark each in the form of multiple choices. The question paper shall be from all the subjects of B.F.Sc.
- v. For admission to **M.Sc.** (**Animal Biotechnology**) degree programme, the candidate should be B.Sc. with Biotechnology as a subject. The question paper shall consist of 100 questions of 1 mark each in the form of multiple choices, with questions from Zoology, Chemistry & Biotechnology. The weightage of questions will be 20, 20 & 60 from Zoology, Chemistry & Biotechnology, respectively.



# 2. Admission for Ph.D. degree programme:

- i. Admission for Ph.D. in different subjects of Veterinary Science (Annexure-II) and Ph.D. (Animal Biotechnology) shall be through entrance examination. Candidates shall be admitted as per the merit list generated on the basis of above entrance examination. The cut-off marks of entrance examination for admission will be 45.0 for unreserved and OBC category candidates; and 40.0 for SC and ST category candidates. Further, the requirement of minimum OGPA / percentage of marks for admission shall be 6.00/10 or equivalent OGPA/equivalent percentage of marks (60%) for unreserved and OBC category candidates and 5.50/10 or equivalent OGPA/equivalent percentage of marks (55%) for SC and ST category candidates at B.V.Sc. & A.H. and M.V.Sc. / B.Sc. and M.Sc. For admission in Ph.D. (Animal Biotechnology) candidate should be B.Sc. with Biotechnology as a subject and M.Sc. in Biotechnology.
- ii. In cases where, two or more candidates have obtained equal marks in the entrance examination, the inter-se-merit of such candidates shall be determined in order of the following preference:
  - a. OGPA/percentage of marks in M.V.Sc. /M.Sc. examination.
  - b. In cases where, the OGPA/percentage of marks in M.V.Sc./M.Sc. examination are same, then inter-se-merit of such candidates shall be prepared, on the basis of OGPA/percentage of marks in B.V.Sc. & A.H./B.Sc. examination.
  - c. In cases where, the OGPA/percentage of marks in B.V.Sc. & A.H./B.Sc. examination are same then inter-se-merit of such candidates shall be prepared, on the basis of percentage of marks in Higher Secondary School Certificate Examination (12<sup>th</sup> standard).
  - d. In cases where, the percentage of marks shall be same in Higher Secondary School Certificate Examination, the inter-se-merit of such candidates shall be prepared on the basis of age of the candidates. The student having more age shall be higher in merit followed by students having lesser age.
- iii. The question paper for admission in Ph.D. programme shall consist of 100 questions of one mark each in the form of multiple choices. The question paper shall be from the concerned subject.

#### 3. Admission for Post Graduate diploma in Wildlife Health Management:

- i. Admission in post graduate diploma programme in Wildlife Health Management shall be on the basis of OGPA/percentage of marks in B.V.Sc. & A.H. examination.
- ii. In cases where, two or more candidates obtained equal OGPA/percentage of marks in B.V.Sc. & A.H. examination, the inter-se-merit of such candidates shall be determined in order of the following preference:



- a. In cases where, the OGPA/percentage of marks in B.V.Sc. & A.H. are same, then inter-se-merit of such candidates shall be prepared on the basis of percentage of marks in Higher Secondary School Certificate Examination (12<sup>th</sup> standard).
- b. In cases where, the percentage of marks shall be same in Higher Secondary School Certificate Examination, the inter-se-merit of such candidates shall be prepared on the basis of age of the candidates. The candidate having more age shall be higher in merit followed by candidates having lesser age.

# 4. Admission of ICAR candidates and fellowship holders:

Admission of ICAR candidate and fellowship holders shall be over and above the prescribed seats (Annexure-II). They have to apply in the prescribed admission form along with required amount; however, they need not to appear for University entrance examination. The subject wise vacant seats of the ICAR shall be converted into subject wise college seats of the University and shall be filled on the basis of merit list generated by entrance examination.

# 5. <u>Admission of in-service candidate of Nanaji Deshmukh Veterinary Science</u> <u>University, Jabalpur and Government of Madhya Pradesh:</u>

Admission to candidate of Nanaji Deshmukh Veterinary Science University, Jabalpur and candidates of Government of Madhya Pradesh shall be over and above the prescribed seats (Annexure-II). However, they have to appear in University entrance examination. The vacant seats of candidates of NDVSU and Government of Madhya Pradesh, shall not be converted into University seats.

# 6. Reservation of seats:

Reservation of seats shall be governed by the existing rules/policy of the State Government of Madhya Pradesh.

- ii. The result of the entrance examination shall be displayed on the University and College Notice boards and shall also be uploaded on the website of the University (www.ndvsu.org) on the date of declaration of result.
- iii. The detailed schedule of Online/ Offline counseling will be available on the university website. No separate intimation will be sent for counseling. The candidates are advised to visit university website regularly for updates.
- iv. The proposed dates are tentative if there is any change it will be notified through University website.
- v. Candidate should ensure eligibility before applying for the entrance examination.
- vi. Candidate selected for admission through entrance examination conducted by the NDVSU may seek admission only during the session for which examination has been conducted.
- vii. The availability of seats in different subjects / programmes is given in Annexure-II.

# 8. Cost and availability of Post Graduate Prospectus and Application Form:

# 9. Last Date for submission of application form:

Two copies of the Application Form along with two copies of Entrance Test Admit card complete in all respect has to be submitted to the office of the **Director of Instruction**, **Nanaji Deshmukh Veterinary Science University**, **Administrative Block**, **Adhartal**, **Jabalpur 482004** by Registered / Speed Post or by hand so as to reach the office of the Director of Instruction on or before the last date of submission of Application Form i.e. **21-12-2021 upto 4:30 pm**. Application Forms received after due date or without requisite fee will not be accepted. The Entrance Test Admit card should not be attached with application form and must be kept separately.

# 10. Mode of selection:

The candidates under each category shall be admitted in order of merit based on result of the entrance examination, conducted by the University for Admission to M.V.Sc. / M.F.Sc./M.Sc./ Ph.D. degree programme. Admission to post graduate diploma program, shall be on the basis of merit list prepared according to OGPA/percentage of marks obtained in B.V.Sc.& A.H. examination. In the first counseling, only candidates of NDVSU / domiciles of Madhya Pradesh can participate. In the second counseling, both candidates of NDVSU / domiciles of Madhya Pradesh and other University/state candidates can participate. Before the second counseling, students admitted during first counseling shall be given preference for the up gradation of subject and campus.

# 11. Residential requirement and maximum permissible time limit for completion of post graduate degree:

The Minimum and maximum time limit for completion of Masters', Ph.D. degree and post graduate diploma programmes has been indicated below:

Note: \*Those students who are M.Sc. in Biotechnology, from the university other than NDVSU, Jabalpur, shall have to register additional courses as per the requirement.



## 12. Medium of instruction:

The medium of instruction shall be English for all post graduate programmes.

## 13. Hostel facilities:

Moderately furnished single / double seated rooms in limited number are available in hostels at each campus, both for boys and girls. Electricity bill shall have to be paid by the students as per rules for consumption of energy / electricity, other than hostel fees etc.

# 14. Medical facilities:

A part time doctor is available for consultation for students and staff at each campus in College dispensary.

# 15. <u>Library facilities:</u>

Each college has been provided with a library, which is well equipped with books, journals, CeRA, CD ROM and updated CDs containing references / abstracts of articles on different subjects.

## 16. Admission for enrolment:

(i) Candidates selected for admission shall be required to show all the original certificates and mark sheets on the day of document verification, to fulfill the minimum requirement for admission.

Two separate sets of self attested photocopies of the following documents have to be submitted:

- a. Mark sheet and certificate of each examination, from HSSC exam on wards
- b. Certificate of date of birth
- c. Migration certificate and Transfer certificate
- d. Other certificates / testimonials.
- e. Submission of Provisional Degree Certificate (PDC) on the day of admission shall be essential, without which, candidate shall not be allowed for admission in any programme of the University.
- (ii) After verification of documents the candidate has to deposit the enrolment and admission fees along with other fees as notified by the University, in the office of the Dean/Director, of the College/Centre/School, to which student is admitted.
- (iii) If the candidate fails to deposit prescribed fees **within due date**, his / her admission shall be treated as cancelled and the vacant seat shall be allotted to other candidate on the basis of merit.
- (iv) Once the candidate accepts admission he/ she will be bonafide student of the NDVSU and he/ she would thereafter be governed by all the rules and regulations applicable in the university.



## 17. Registration:

A selected candidate after payment of his / her fees for admission shall get himself / herself registered in person within the prescribed date. No candidate under any circumstances shall be permitted to register himself / herself after the expiry of date or stipulated time, in first and subsequent semesters, as notified from time to time. He /she has to pay all the fees on the date of registration in every semester. If the student fails to register his / her courses in stipulated time his / her admission would be cancelled.

# 18. Registration by continuing students:

Students who are already on the roll of the University have to be present physically before the Dean / Director of the College / Centre / School and pay requisite fees prescribed for a semester and register the prescribed courses. Late payment of fees and registration of courses shall be permitted by the Dean / Director of the College / Centre / School up to six working days following the prescribed date of registration with prescribed late fee. However, the Director of Instruction may permit late registration up to 4 more working days, on valid grounds with late fees.

# 19. Cancellation of admission:

If it is found at any stage that candidate has obtained admission by suppression or false presentation of facts, his / her admission shall be liable to automatic cancellation. In such case no refund of fees shall be allowed.

# 20. Migration certificate:

Candidate who have passed the qualifying examination from the university other than Nanaji Deshmukh Veterinary Science University, Jabalpur, shall be required to produce the Migration Certificate within six months of registration in the University.

# 21. Withdrawal from University:

A student who desires to get withdrawal from the University has to apply in writing for a withdrawal certificate, to the Director of Instruction, through the Dean of the College / Director of Centre / School, which shall be granted to him / her on clearance of all his / her dues of the University.

#### 22. Credit hour requirements for Master's and Ph.D. Degree programme:

The student admitted in the University will have to follow the course curriculum prescribed from time to time by the University, which shall be issued by the Dean / Director of the respective College / Centre / School, at the time of registration.

- ii. Major subject: The subject/discipline in which the student takes admission.
- iii. Minor subject: The subject closely related to the student's Major subject. Minor subject shall be only from one department.
- iv. Supporting subject: A post graduate student may also be required to take one additional subject, as per the requirement of his research work, on the recommendation of the Advisory Committee.
- v. Non-Credit Compulsory Courses: Non- credit courses are of general nature and are compulsory for Master's degree programme. For students of Animal Biotechnology two additional non credits courses (PGS 504 & 505) are compulsory.
- vi. Students of M.Sc. and Ph.D. (Animal Biotechnology) shall have to register for non-credit compulsory courses.
- vii. Students of post graduate diploma programme have to register compulsory non credit course of WHM-406 (Library Science and Computer application in Wildlife).

# 23. Advisory system:

Every student admitted to post graduate programme shall have an Advisory Committee. For Master's degree there shall be minimum three Members, two from Major subject, including Chairman/ Major Advisor, and one from Minor subject. For Ph.D. degree, there shall be minimum four members in advisory committee, two from Major subject, including Chairman/ Major Advisor and one each from Minor and supporting subjects. However, one additional member can be included depending upon the research topic. If the thesis research is under joint programme of this university and other collaborating Institute, a scientist/teacher of collaborating Institute having Ph.D. / equivalent degree may be appointed as Co-Major Advisor. For post graduate diploma programme major advisor from School of Wildlife Forensic & Health, will be responsible for supervising the student.

## 24. Total period of permissible gap:

- i. A semester dropped after due permission from the Director of Instruction, shall not be counted towards the residential requirement. However, semester washed out on account of use of unfair means/indiscipline shall be counted towards the residential requirement.
- ii. A student whose semester has been dropped /washed out, can resume his/her studies in the subsequent year, in the semester in which he/she left his/her studies, provided that, he/she has completed at least one semester as a regular student.
- iii. The total period of gap shall not exceed 4 semesters for M.V.Sc. and 6 semesters for Ph.D. including the semester in which he/she left his/her studies. The total period of gap shall not exceed two semesters for post graduate diploma programme. During the gap no fees shall be charged from the student. Permission of the gap has to be obtained from the Director of Instructions, on the recommendation of the major advisor. Gap shall be permissible only once during the course of programme, provided that he/she has completed at least one semester as a regular student.



# 25. Seminar requirement for post graduate programme:

- a. A student admitted to Master's Degree programme shall register for one credit seminar to be delivered before the end of 3<sup>rd</sup> semester, while Ph.D. student has to register for two seminars each of one credit in 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> or 4<sup>th</sup> semester.
- b. In addition to this, a post graduate student has to deliver a synopsis seminar also. The synopsis seminar shall be held for the approval of synopsis of research work.
- **c.** Master's and Ph.D. students are required to present his/her research findings before the house, prior to submission of thesis for evaluation.

# 26. Attendance requirement:

- a. Attendance of a student in a course shall be at least 75% of the scheduled classes in a semester, failing which he / she shall be debarred from appearing in the final examination. For this purpose, theory and practical classes shall be counted separately.
- b. If all the students of a class remain absent en-mass from the classes, for a period exceeding 15 working days continuously in a semester, the entire semester shall be treated as cancelled and the fee, etc. paid by the students shall be forfeited.
- c. The Dean of the College /Director of Centre/School may condone the shortage of attendance up to 5% of the scheduled classes on valid grounds on the recommendation of the committee of the College / Centre / School level.
- d. If a student falls short of attendance in any course (s), theory or practical (s), he / she shall not be allowed to appear in the final theory or practical examination and he / she shall be treated as fail in that course.

#### 27. Examination and evaluation:

a. The academic performance of a student shall be assessed through theory and practical examination conducted during semester. The weightage of different examination shall be as follows:

Mid- term examination – 20 Practical examination – 50 Final theory examination – 80

- b. Mid-term examination of a course shall be conducted in the middle of each semester. The questions asked shall cover approximately 50% of the course contents. The question paper should be of 50% objective and 50% subjective (short questions).
- c. Final theory examination of all courses shall be common for all the campii of the University. The final theory question paper for M.V.Sc. shall consist of objective type (20 marks) and subjective type (60 marks) questions. However, for Ph.D. the question paper shall consist of 10 marks objective and 70 marks subjective type questions,
- d. Final theory examination for post graduate diploma programme shall be conducted by the School of Wildlife Forensic & Health and shall consist of 50% questions of objective type and 50% subjective type.



e. Practical examination of all courses shall be conducted prior to final theory examination.

# 28. <u>Dissertation for Post graduate diploma programme:</u>

Student admitted for post graduate diploma programme has to submit his/her dissertation work as per the guidelines for thesis writing manual to the major advisor. The same has to be presented before dissertation evaluation committee, comprises of Director of Instruction, Director of the School for Wildlife Forensic & Health and major advisor. The post graduate diploma will be awarded on obtaining satisfactory grade for the dissertation work.

# 29. Comprehensive examination:

- a. Comprehensive examination in post graduate degree programme shall be conducted on completion of 75% course work, separately in Major and Minor subjects. It shall be non-credit examination and the grade to be awarded as Satisfactory/Unsatisfactory on getting 60% qualifying marks.
- b. For Master's degree, there shall be two papers of 100 marks each, one from major subjects and other from minor subjects. There shall be no viva-voce examination for Masters Degree programme after comprehensive written examination.
- c. For Ph.D. there shall be three papers of 100 marks each, two from Major and one from Minor subjects. After successful completion of written Comprehensive examination, Ph.D. student shall have to appear for viva voce examination. Viva voce shall be conducted by an external examiner approved by the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor and the advisory committee.

# 30. Grading:

Grading shall be done on ten-point scale. Marks secured by a student shall be converted into Overall Grade Point Average (OGPA) on 10 point scale.

# 31. Thesis research work for post graduate Degree:

A post graduate student besides registering Major and Minor courses has to register for thesis work as suggested by the Student's Advisory Committee and approved by the Director of Instruction. The subject of the thesis work and the results / conclusion presented should be of sufficient importance for publication. The thesis shall be on a topic within the field of Major discipline and shall embody the student's original work.

# 32. Conduct and discipline:

The student has to obey the rules and regulations of the University. Students are expected to maintain good relationship with the University authorities, teachers and non-teaching staff of the University. It shall be presumed that guardians of the students have agreed, that their wards shall comply with the rules and regulations of the University and behave politely with the authorities/teachers/staff of the University. Failure to comply with these rules shall make the concerned student liable for disciplinary action including the student's expulsion from the University.

- The university will not pay TA/DA or any other expenses for appearing in the entrance test and admission.
- Absentees for any reason whatsoever, will not be considered for admission.
- The selected candidate must verified their original documents and deposit entire prescribed fee on due date, failing which their claim for admission shall stand cancelled.
- Dates of counseling will not be changed under ordinary conditions, even if it is declared a holiday.
- The academic council of the university is the supreme academic authority to frame rules and regulations, increase/decrease the admission capacity and categories and to decide all other matters relating to admissions and academic affairs. The academic council also has the right to promote or discontinue any programme whatsoever.
- All the programmes of the university are full time programmes. A student therefore cannot study more than one programme at a time.
