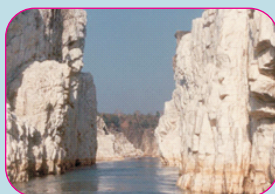
About the Department of Animal Nutrition, Jabalpur

ABOUT THE COURSE

Current scenario of animal production system in India, livestock plays a major role in rural livelihood. Improvement in any of their aspect like feeding, genetics and management will results in increased production in terms of milk, meat and egg production and also increases farmers income. The training program is conceived with an idea for optimizing the utilization of available resources and balanced feeding, knowledge sharing among all stakeholders, area specific mineral mixture, use of azolla in livestock feeding, round the year fodder production, small scale silage production, improving the milk quality by feeding interventions, feeding management of transition animals to prevent metabolic disorders, feeding of new born calves for better immunity. There are several nutritional strategies to improve production potential of animals. The theme of Short course will deal with such nutritional approaches to augment animal productivity for doubling farmer's income.

ELIGIBILITY

Assistant Professor/Scientist or above or equivalent from the concerned/related subjects working under State Agriculture/Veterinary Universities, Krishi Vigyan Kendra, ICAR institute/ Basic Science institute of recognized University.

HOW TO APPLY

Visit website: ICAR <http://cbp.icar.gov.in/> and login as candidate with your login ID and password. After login- click on “participate in training” link, click on short course, select the desired course. Fill the proforma and submit the form. Take the print out of submitted form and get approved from competent authority. Then scan it and upload the approved copy at above mentioned portal before last date. An advanced (Scanned) copy of the application form may be sent to course director through email. After receiving confirmation mail from the course director, please notify your acceptance for the training.

A registration fee (non refundable) of Rs. 50 per participants will be collected from the participants at the time of registration in form of demand draft (preferably from Nationalized Bank like SBI) in favor of Comptroller, NDVSU payable at SBI, Main Branch, Civil lines Jabalpur (IFSC code SBIN0000329).

TRAVEL

The participants will be reimbursed to and fro travel fare by shortest rail (2 tier /3 tier AC tickets)/road route as per ICAR norms on production of valid travel tickets.

University is located at the centre of the city hardly 500 meters away from Jabalpur railway station. It is very well connected by railway and road transport from all part of the country. The weather in July and August is pleasant.
